Local and state officials oppose Green Light Bill

CHENANGO COUNTY - Local and state officials voiced their concerns against the recently passed Green Light Bill, stating the bill could lead to more issues than it's worth in the future.

According to a statement from the New York State Senate, bill number S1747B, the Green Light Bill, was created in response to the need to secure driving privileges for all residents of New York, including undocumented immigrants, which

they said has been a long term effort that has reached the pinnacle of urgency. The bill passed on Monday night.

Senator Fred Akshar discussed the merits of the bill, stating, "The so-called "Green Light Bill" flies in the face of common sense. It essentially rewards those who break the law and is a slap in the face to law-abiding New Yorkers and to new Americans who have taken the appropriate steps to do things the right way and become citizens legally."

Sheriff Ernest Cutting Jr. also spoke on the bill, stating that as it was originally written, the bill wouldn't allow law enforcement to motor vehicle records.

"It made no sense, the bill took away law enforcement's ability to look up DMV records, which is why the Chenango County Board of Supervisors passed a resolution opposing it," said Cutting. "Since then, I believe they have changed that portion of the bill, but I think some of these things are just sliding down the hill, and someone needs to put the breaks on."

He said with changes like these being made overnight, many taxpayers are and should be outraged.

"We've established systems to do things the right way, why are we suddenly changing things now?" Cutting asked.

He said if mandated by New York State legislators to honor undocumented immigrant driver licenses, the sheriff's office would comply.

Chenango County Clerk Mary Weidman also spoke on the issue, stating that many clerks have been outright opposed to the Green Light Bill without doing more research into how it might be accomplished.

"Many people in county governments have been reacting negatively to the Green Light legislations," said Weidman. "I think the reaction was not inappropriate, but all we're hearing are reactions that are looking at the worse case scenarios."

She said currently DMV offices are effectively dealing with people who come in with foreign passports, and look up department of New York State provides the resources to deal with those cases.

"In our responsibilities as county clerks, we issue passports, pistol permits, we do motor vehicle licenses, all of those agencies provide resources and guidelines to follow," said Weidman. "Our responsibility is to follow those guidelines and meet the standards they provide."

Senator discusses survey about vaccinations

NEW Senator Fred Akshar released the results of his latest online surveys asking constituents to weigh in on a proposal to end religious and any other non-medical exemptions for vaccination for children attending school in New York State.

All 50 states require students that be vaccinated for diseases like measles, mumps, whooping chickenpox cough, and polio. All states allow exemptions for medical reasons, but 47 including New York allow exemptions for religious reasons and 16 also permit "philosophical exemptions."

According to Centers the Disease Control and Prevention, measles cases nationwide have more than doubled from 2018 to over 1000 this year, with at least 850 cases in the New York City and Rockland County regions of New York.

Akshar sought input on Senate bill S.2994 which would repeal all non-medical exemptions from vaccination requirements for children.

The survey, posted on Akshar.NYSenate. Gov drew over 3,000 total responses from residents in the 52nd Senate District and surrounding areas.

Within the 52nd Senate District, 70% of respondents support removing all non-medical exemptions for vaccinations.

Many of those supporting the removal of non-medical exemptions cited the need to protect public health, noting that requiring vaccinations for chil-

dren protects those who are unable to receive vaccinations due to allergic reactions or other complications from contracting these diseases.

Responses other regions of New York outside the 52nd Senate District showed a plurality of 42.5% believing that no vaccinations for children should be required by


Of those opposed to any vaccination requirements, many stated that the choice on whether to vaccinate should ultimately fall to each child's parents. Others said the exemption was a matter of religious freedom.

Results from respondents in the 52nd Senate District were similar to a recent Siena Poll, which showed 84% of New Yorkers statewide support ending the religious exemption for vaccinations.

"Eliminating non-medical exemptions for child vaccination raises serious questions about the balance of personal choice, religious freedom and the public health and safety of our children," Akshar said. "From speaking with local educators and health professionals, it's clear to me that in the case of vaccinations, this is simply a matter of public health and safety. In this case, a parent's personal choice for their own child has the potential to do serious harm to many other children in their school and community."

Throughout the 2019-2020 Legislative Session, Akshar will regularly post new Community Voice Survey questions on Akshar.NYSenate.Gov and publish the results of previously asked questions.

"No matter my personal views on any issue, it's important for me to continually allow the people of the 52nd Senate District to weigh in, be heard and share the results," Akshar said. "It's about continuing to be open and accountable to the people."

with county clerks from the 122nd Assembly District shared their thoughts and concerns on the passage of the Green Light Bill.

"I have said this before and I will say it again, we should not be issuing driver's licenses to people who are here illegally," said Crouch. "It legitimizes illegal immigration and encourages it to continue.

"Today's passage of the 'Green Light Bill' once again shows how out of touch assembly democrats really are, as a recent Siena poll showed that over 53 percent of voters do not support this initiative. With just two weeks left in this year's legislative session it's time we get back on track and address the real issues facing New Yorkers."

Finch also addressed the bill, stating that other representatives on both sides of the senate should, "reject this senseless attack on citizenship."

"This is the linchpin of the Democrats' ongoing effort to normalize illegal immigration," said Finch. "It's wrong. It was wrong when

Democrats voted to give illegals free college tuition. It was wrong for Democrats to give criminals facing deportation taxpayer-funded lawyers. This is even worse than that."

Several clerks from counties including Cayuga, Otsego, Delaware, and Broome counties spoke against the bill.

"As the Cayuga County Clerk, I have overseen the DMV Office in Auburn for the past 15 years," said Cayuga County Clerk Sue Dwyer. "Every day, per state law, we require U.S. citizens to provide us with several forms of identification before we can process their transactions.

"Sometimes, have to make several trips back to our DMV office with additional documentation in order to meet the strict requirements set by the state. It is absolutely mind-boggling that the Democrats in the assembly passed legislation allowing people who are in our country illegally to walk up to a DMV counter to apply for a NYS Driver's License by giving DMV staff as little as a foreign document that we

even question."

Another clerk, from Otsego County, said the county won't issue a license to individuals who can't provide six points of identification.

"Otsego County will not issue a license to anyone who cannot produce six points of ID," said Otsego County Clerk, Kathy Sinnott Gardner. am opposed to illegal immigrants obtaining a New York State Driver's License. What makes people think just because they are issued a driver's license our roads will be safer? Yes, some might register and insure their cars, but I'm betting most won't."

Clerks from Delaware and Broome County, also discussed other potential issues with the bill.

"As clerks we do not have any way of verifying foreign documents they will use for identification, nor the means for an interpreter so we can understand what they are asking for," said Delaware County Clerk, Debra Goodrich.

"This is nothing more than an unfunded mandate on local governments," argued

can't authenticate or Broome County Clerk Joe Mihalko. "In Broome County alone, it's estimated that 500 undocumented immigrants will be eligible for immediate licensure, yet the state is not giving us a dime to hire additional staff to handle the influx, verify the authenticity of foreign identification or assist with language translation needs. As written, it'll be a logistical nightmare for county-operated DMVs."

As written in the bill, from farm labor to construction jobs, the tight rates have created a lower of supply of workers to many sectors in New York's economy.

How Much Wood Could A Woodchuck Chuck?



How much wood could a woodchuck chuck If a woodchuck could chuck wood?

Compared to beagroundhogs/ woodchucks are not adept at moving timber, although some will chew wood. (At Cornell, woodchucks that gnaw their wooden nest boxes are given scraps of 2-by-4 lumber.) A wildlife biologist once measured the inside volume of a typical woodchuck burrow and estimated that -- if wood filled the hole instead of dirt -the industrious animal would have chucked about 700 pounds' worth.

Usually seen sitting on top of his burrow comfortably chewing his tuft of grass, the woodchuck probably outnumbers most animals and certainly humans in the Unadill Valley. They are a fat, pudgy and somewhat comical rodent.

The woodchuck is one of several North American animals whose name has Native American origins. Unfortunately, those exact origins are unknown. Early colonists in New England reported that "wuchak" was the name for the animal in a local Algonquian language, but this word was never recorded in a dictionary and the Algonquian languages of that region are no longer natively spoken,

so the original form of the word has been lost to time. It may have actually been the word for a fisher (a member of the weasel family) instead, since the word for fisher sounds similar to wuchak in living Algonquian languages (such as the Cree word ocek, pronounced similar to oo-check.) Or it might have been an English corruption of a longer word like the Narragansett word ockqutchaun, which did refer to a woodchuck. In any case, Englishspeaking Americans later adapted the name "wuchak" into the modern form "woodchuck," which was easier for them to remember.

One of the more favorite Algonquian myths of legends connected to woodcucks are those groups of stories relating Grandmother Woodchuck. She's the grandmother of Glooskap, a culture hero among the Wabanaki tribes. Glooskap is reminiscent of Hercules, since he's always fighting monsters and making the world safe for humans. There's a little bit of Merlin in him as well, because he's a powerful magician. But really he's a unique being in his own right. Unlike Hercules or Merlin, he's a trickster, purely good-hearted, and more than a little naive. Despite all his powers, he often makes dumb mistakes.

The name given to the Woodchuck was originally an Algonquian name taken from the word "wuchak" which was used to describe different animals of similar size and color. They are largest member of the squirrel family and part of the Order Rodentia, which includes rats, mice, squirrels, prairie dogs, chipmunks, beavers and porcupines. Out of these animals, only the beaver and porcupine is larger than the woodchuck. Also known as the groundhog or whistle-pig, its closest relative is the yellow bellied marmot and the hoary marmot.

The woodchuck inhabits farm fields, open land and suburban neighborhoods in Canada and the Northeast and Northwest United States. Identified by its blackish brown fur, stout body, short legs, brown feet, short bristly tail and flat head, the woodchuck has four five feet below ground and length-wise extend for thirty feet.

The woodchuck is often seen on warm days basking in the They sleep on sun. fence posts, stone walls, large rocks, fallen logs and grassy areas close to their burrows. The woodchuck hibernation in early October and seals the entrance to its burrow with dirt. They come out of hibernation in March and even later in the north. During the winter, while the woodchuck is hibernating under ground, rabbits will sometimes use a portion of the burrow as a nest.

Come summertime when the burrow is vacant, it is used by cottontail rabbits. opossums, raccoons, skunks and foxes who sometimes enlarge it to create a nursery den. The woodchuck peas, squash, zucchini, cucumbers and ber-These animals have been known to damage vegetable and flower gardens, crops, orchards, nurseries and around buildings.

Male woodchucks have been known to travel long distances to find a mate. Once together, the male and female remain a couple until their young are born. The female gives birth to four naked, blind and helpless pups in April or May.

The number of woodchucks has grown since the clearing of forests for farmland. Woodchucks have a series of squeals, grunts and other sounds when caught, when fighting or injured or defending its territory and family. Preyed upon by foxes, hawks, coyotes, and



clawed toes on its front feet and five clawed toes on its hind feet. They have small ears, large black eyes and a white patch around its

woodchuck is often their preferred foods. found near a major source of food in open fields, meadows, pastures, fences and woodland edges. They are also found under barns, sheds and porches. Woodchucks can move about 700 pounds of dirt when digging their burrows, made up of an entrance, a spy hole, a nesting area, and an excretion area. The main entrance is usually found with a pile of dirt near it at the base of a tree that is stripped of bark near the bottom of the tree; this is the result from the woodchuck marking it ter-

dogs, they will defend their burrow when it is invaded by skunks and weasels. When escaping from predators, the woodchuck will run into its burrow quickly and escape using one of its other entrances. They can also swim and climb trees when escaping.

Manufactured Housing Today

FACTORY-BUILT HOUSING

Many types of structures are built in the factory and designed for long-term residential use. In the case of manufactured and modular homes, units are built in a factory, transported to the site and installed. In panelized and pre-cut homes, essentially flat subassemblies (factory-built panels or factory-cut building materials) are transported to the site and assembled. The different types of factory-built housing can be summarized as follows:

Manufactured Homes: These are homes built entirely in the factory, transported to the site, and installed under a federal building code administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Federal Manufactured Home Construction and Safety Standards (commonly known as the HUD Code) went into effect June 15, 1976. The

housing design and
construction,
strength and
durability,
transportability,
fire resistance,
energy efficiency
and quality. The
HUD Code also
sets performance
standards for the
heating, plumbing,



air conditioning, thermal and electrical systems. It is the only federally-regulated national building code. On-site additions, such as garages, decks and porches, often add to the attractiveness of manufactured homes and must be built to local, state or regional building codes.

Modular Homes: These factory-built homes are built to the state, local or regional code where the home will be located. Modules are transported to the site and installed.

Panelized Homes: These are factory-built homes in which panels—a whole wall with windows, doors, wiring and outside siding—are transported to the site and assembled. The homes must meet state or local building codes where they are sited.

Pre-Cut Homes: This is the name for factory-built housing in which building materials are factory-cut to design specifications, transported to the site and assembled. Pre-cut homes include kit, log and dome homes. These homes must meet local, state or regional building codes.

Mobile Homes: This is the term used for manufactured homes produced prior to June 15, 1976, when the HUD Code went into effect. By 1970, these homes were built to voluntary industry standards that were eventually enforced by 45 of the 48 contiguous states.

DESIGN INNOVATIONS

In the last several years, the manufactured housing industry has seen rapid growth in the aesthetic variety of manufactured housing, helping the homes appeal to a broader market than ever before. The addition of new plants and the introduction of new transportation technologies have enabled factories to increase interior ceiling height up to nine feet on many homes. Also, "hinged roof" systems allow designers to produce homes with roof pitches of up to 12:12, so that manufactured homes can blend seamlessly into existing neighborhoods.

WHY ARE BUILDERS AND DEVELOPERS USING MANUFACTURED HOME?

The single most important advancement in the industry over the last seven years has been the development of two-story models. Until recently, engineering and materials technology, the physical constraints of many factories, and transportation issues made the possibility of multi-story manufactured homes seem like a pipe dream. However, the development of innovative chassis and transportation systems have enabled manufacturers and developers to work together to produce attractive and affordable two-story units. While multi-story models are still a small percentage of the overall manufactured housing market, the tremendous consumer interest in the concept will translate into more and more manufacturers adding them to their housing lineup in the near future.

Successful builder-developers have discovered that manufactured housing can help them:

• Effectively expand their current market.

With a minimum of time, labor and cost, builders can add substantially to their annual production by using manufactured homes.

• Provide a high-quality product at a lower cost than site-built housing. Factory building maximizes efficiencies and takes advantage of economies of scale to produce a comparable product at significantly less cost.

• Meet pent-up consumer demand for entry-level, single-family detached housing.

Rising costs have made it difficult to build for the entry - level home buyer. Manufactured housing makes it possible for the builder-developer to meet the needs of this growing market.

• Produce housing using significantly less on-site labor.

The factory essentially functions as one huge subcontractor on the structure of the house itself. This makes the builder-developer less vulnerable to the problems of a shrinking construction labor pool.

• Secure long-term income.


Land-lease communities in particular offer an attractive long-term stream of income that you can depend on - something almost unheard of in single-family residential development.





• Utilize property that might otherwise be financially or technically difficult to develop.

Manufactured homes can help builder-developers build new homes in costsensitive markets, take advantage of difficult or environmentally sensitive home sites, and make the most of lots in areas where security is a concern. Many builders also like the ability to additionally customize the house on site by adding such features as garages, porches and decks.



Each manufactured home must be designed according to the federal Manufactured Home Construction and Safety Standards at 24 CFR 3280, commonly called the HUD Code. The HUD Code stipulates, at §3280.305(c)(3), that the home shall be designed and constructed to conform to one of three roof load zones. The appropriate roof load used in design is dependent on where the home will be initially installed. Homes designed and constructed to a higher Roof Load Zone can be installed in a lower Roof Load Zone (a home designed to a North Zone can be installed in a Middle or

South Roof Load Zone). However, a South Roof Load Zone home cannot be installed in either a Middle or North Roof Load Zone.

Roof load (live load) design is affected by the shape of the roof whether it is flat, curved or pitched. Roof loads are a downward (vertical) force on the home. The North Zone, Middle Zone and the South Zone are identified on the roof load zone map above. This downward imposed load on the home is also known as the snow load. The North Zone design live load equates to 40 pounds per square foot, the Middle Zone equates to 30 pounds per square foot, and the South Zone equates to 20 pounds per square foot.





The Susquehanna River Park Trail, located in the City of Oneonta, is the first section of the Oneonta Susquehanna Greenway to be completed. A full circuit of the loop trail offers two miles of easy, flat walking or crosscountry skiing. Interpretive markers, keyed to a leaflet obtainable at the trailhead enhance the experience educational. The trail was largely built by volunteer labor recruited by the Oneonta Susquehanna Greenway Committee.







will be **TAB BENOIT**, returning to the festival with his namesake band for the first time since 2006. In the meantime he has won four Blues Music Awards as Entertainer of the Year and has been nominated for three Grammy Awards.

Preceding Benoit on the Infield stage will be the **DOWNCHILD BLUES BAND**, celebrating its 50th year of performing. The Toronto based group has released more than 20 recordings and has won every major Canadian music award several times over. Dan Akroyd credits the band as the inspiration for the Blues Brothers and he contributed a harmonica solo to its 2010 release.

Also on the infield stage will be **DANIELLE NICOLE** who was nominated for a 2019 Grammy Award for her most recent recording, "Cry No More." She is a singer, songwriter and bass player who has been nominated for Blues Music Awards in the categories of vocalist, bass guitar, and contemporary blues female artist of the year for this year.

Opening up the stage will be the **BRIAN GOLDEN EXPERIMENT**, and following him will be the return of New Orleans harmonica player and accordionist, JUMPIN' JOHNNY SANSONE.

THE NELSON AND FLANAGAN TENT STAGE

will be opened by **JONTAVIOUS WILLIS**. At 22, he has already been lauded by fellow artists such as Taj Mahal and Paul Oscher. Playing guitar, harmonica, banjo and cigar box, he played on the most recent Rhythm and Blues cruise.

He will be followed by a show that organizers of the event have been trying to book for years: **POKEY LAFARGE**, organizers said in the release. His music blends blues, bluegrass, ragtime, western swing and old time country into "something timeless whose only mandate is that it has to swing."

Third on the stage will be **JOE LOUIS WALKER** whose most recent release is as an acoustic trio, and it received a Blues Music Award nomination for Album of the Year. He will be joined by Kenny "Blues Boss" Wayne on piano and Giles Robson on harp for the performance.

Closing out the tent and festival will be a special show featuring MISSISSIPPI HEAT with special guest Lurrie Bell.




