

NORWICH-Chobani announced April 11 it will double the amount of funds donated in its Community Impact Fund in an effort to further promote economic opportunity and entrepreneurship in Central New York and the Magic Valley in Idaho.

In expanding its Community Impact Fund, Chobani will contribute \$200,000 this year in Central New York. Grant applications from residents of Delaware, Chenango, Madison and Otsego counties will be accepted throguh June 2019, and will be awarded later this year.

"At Chobani, we do more than make yogurt," said Chobani

in a statement. "Each work and every day, we try to make a difference. By increasing the size of the fund and allowing multi-year grants, we're unlocking the potential for organizations to build bigger and bolder initiatives that can drive meaningful, lasting change for communities across Central New York."

Chobani will donate \$200k

Last year, Oxford Academy and Central School District and Sidney Central School District were among the four grant recipients of the inaugural Community **Impact** Fund for Central New York, which awarded \$100,000 in the region.

Oxford schools received the maximum awarded grant of \$30,000 to pay the wages and payroll costs of 25 students participating in a 10-month

experience. Sidney schools received \$21,000 to help incorporate a student-run food truck, offering fresh, locally harvested, healthy food options for school meals.





"Iroquoian Snow Snakes"





It was another "country humor" way to scare farm children. Instead of Vermont dairy cows whose shorter legs on one side caused them to tumble down the hill if they reversed their grazing directions; or

their tail in their mouth and rolled down the hill to catch and bite you, it was Snow Snakes buried in the deep snow. If the snow snake bit you it caused your immediate death due to your blood instantly freez-"hoop snakes" who took ing. Fortunately none of

these imaginary animals exist but in fact, the snow snakes are not a rare species of serpent, it is a winter game played by the Iroquois during winter times.

The game of Snakes Snow is an ancient (Iroquois) Haudenosaunee winter game but remains popular yet today amongst the Iroquois

After returning from the fall-winter hunt, the game was played between individuals, clans, tribes, villages, and Iroquoian nations: Mohawk, Oneida, Tuscarora, Onondaga, Cayuga, and Senecas.

on a frozen snow track. Snow is piled up to a height of about 4 feet at the beginning of the track. A log is then placed on top of the snow pile to make a track within which the shooters must throw their snakes. The track gradually slopes downward to follow the contour of the earth. The team who has the longest distance throws, wins. The best throwers win prizes but more importantly, bragging rights until the next event

The game is usually played by four teams, called "corners," each of whom compete in trying to "throw' their wooden "snow snakes" the longest distance along the snow and ice trough, or track of snow. The game is divided into rounds, and in a round each team gets four throws. At the end of each round, two points are awarded to the team who made the farthest throw in the round, and one point is awarded for the second farthest throw. Play continues until one of the teams wins, by achieving a certain predetermined number of points

There are two roles on a snow snake team: the Player, and the Snow Snake is played Goaler. The main role of a Goaler is to craft tracks, for added interand maintain a team's wooden "snow snakes" in between games. The Goaler is also tasked with selecting which snake will be used for each throw during the game. A Player, meanwhile, is a player who actually throws the snow snakes during a game.

The snow snake is actually a carefully carved piece of maple, ash, hickory, or hornbeam.. There are several kinds of snakes.. The snakes are only 3/4 of an inch in diameter so shooters are very careful with their best snakes The snow snakes used in the game have different names depending on their length. The smallest poles used are the six-inch-long "snow darts." The next size up is the three-foot-long "short snake" Longer poles are known only as "snow snakes", and can be anywhere from six to ten feet in length Snow Snakes can be made from a variety of materials. In The trough, or track, that snow snakes are thrown down is typically five inches deep, rising up in a slope at the end where the players stand. In modern times, some groups will add obstacles like jumps or snow barriers to their

The snow snake is highly smooth and polished. About an inch broad at the lead and tapered down to nearly half an inch at the tail or finger hold end. The head is conical and often covered with lead for balance, momentum, and protection

According to the Iroquois oral traditions the game dates back more than 500 years, before the arrival of Europeans in North America. Originally a form of communication between villages, the throwing of "snow snakes" in a trough of snow developed into a competitive sport during long winters when the long track was not used for communication.https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Snow_ snake - cite_note-gan-3 The name "snow snake" is said to have come from the serpentine wiggling motion of the poles as they slide down the icy track. Good players are able to throw a snow snake n an iced track for a distance from 300-400 yards, and exceptional players claim greater distances. Distances increase depending upon the angle of down grade







LOST STREAM MAP

The recently published STREAM MAP OF NEW YORK resembles another map known to Pennsylvania anglers as the

"Lost Stream Map."

The "Stream Map of Pennsylvania"
was completed in 1965 after a thirtyyear effort by Howard Higbee, a forme Penn State Professor.

Professor Higbee succeeded in reating a map of the highest detail possible - a map that shows every tream and lake. He painstaking plotted by hand, the location of 45,000 miles of streams onto a 3 by 5 foot ma

Experts told Professor Higbee that eprints were impossible, because the aps were printed in non-photographic

Then, in 1991, at the age of 91, Howard Higbee's dream came true. Computers made it possible to reprint the map. Holding an updated map, Howard said, "I never thought I'd live to

see this day."



- Keep it covered. RV roofs are susceptible to sun and environmental damage. Store the RV under a steel RV carport or cover it using a product specifically designed for an RV. Remember to routinely inspect and clean the roof of the camper as well.
- Check for leaks. Look under the RV and/or tow vehicle for any signs of leaks. Repair leaks promptly. Transmission fluid leaks can lead to vehicle fires. When checking for leaks, check fluid levels to ensure they're at the proper level. This includes engine oil, transmission fluid, power steering fluid, windshield washer fluid, and brake fluid.
- Check radiator coolant. Radiator coolant is another important fluid to check. Antifreeze protects the engine in cold temperatures, but it also helps the engine run cooler in hot temperatures. Wait for the RV to cool down before checking fluids.
- Periodically run the generator. RV generators shouldn't go unused for too long. Gasoline has a short shelf life, and after time it can break down, condense and damage the generator's internal components. Run the generator if the RV has not been used for awhile. Be sure to change the oil and filter of the generator regularly
- Drain and clean water and waste systems. Water systems can benefit from being drained periodically and flushed with clean, fresh water. The disposal waste system needs to be drained as indicated in the owner's manual.
- Lubricate joints and slide-out rails. Avoid rust and corrosion by spraying moving parts with a lubricant spray.

4 reasons to skip topping off at the filling station

The familiar click of the nozzle when filling up at the gas station is recognizable to anyone with a few miles of driving under their belt. So any gas that drivers try to pump into their tanks after the nozzle has clicked may only be drawn into the vapor line and fed back into the gas station's tanks and not your vehicle's fuel tank.

2. Topping off may damage your car.

Topping off won't just hurt your pocketbook; it can potentially damage your vehicle as well. Fuel tanks need extra room inside them so gas can expand while the car is being operated. Without room to expand, gas may evaporate

into the vehicle's vapor collection system, which can damage the system and produce greater gas emissions, thereby harming the planet.

3. Topping off can affect the air you breathe.

If you had a choice, would you pay extra for more air pollution? Likely not. But the EPA notes that this is precisely what many people are doing when they top off their gas tanks.
